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INTERSECTION COLLECTION & Incense-burned drawings series

About the series:

These artworks are created in Nicola Anthony's signaure style. She uses high quality traditional calligraphy paper onto which she creates ink drawings and paintings. She then burns into the surface of the drawings using incense sticks which are purchased or made in the place that the artwork depicts. She layers up the painted surfaces, suspending then on different levels so that light and shadow comes into play and glimpses of the colours or surfaces underneath shine through.

In some artworks, Nicola also uses charred paper, charcoal, mirror, gold leaf, and handmade sunlight lenses to emphasize the light or the shadow.

"I take my time to draw using my paper burning technique, for which I use incense sticks. (These to me are already heavily scented with ideas of spirituality, prayers, or simply freedom and hope). With this method I created what could be viewed as windows, holes, perferations, dots, insights, new visions, voids or scars on the paper skin.

In some cultures, burning is the way to send offerings to the Gods or to the dead. In other cultures burning is synonymous with destruction and loss.

The burning technique takes patience, can result in losing sections of drawing, setting my hair on fire, or scorching my wooden desk. The flame needs to be controlled. But the process of burning the paper skin can be almost meditative: synchronising with the breath; and filling the art studio with the redolent scent of sacred spaces; controlling the perforations." This artwork features St. Paul's Cathedral in London. The artwork is a symbol of human survival, resilience and courage, as well as making a stand, and having faith in ourselves and others. As a point of intersection between Singapore and London, the former Supreme Court of Singapore which is now National Gallery Singapore is said to take inspiration from Christopher Wren's dome design for St. Paul's Cathedral.


Entitled Saint Pauls Survives (Ghosts of the past), this artwork is inspired by the photograph (also captioned 'St. Pauls Survives') published in newspapers after the night raid of 29/30 December 1940, the 114th night of the London Blitz of World War II.

"The photograph has become a symbol of British resilience and courage. In the artwork I wanted to combine the darkness of the aftermath of a battle, with the hope of picking ourselves up and looking to the future. I also included some little human figures who could have been the people of the time (from my Grandparent's generation), the people there today, or perhaps ghosts from further back in the past – London's history is so rich that many stories can be spotted in the shimmering dust which floats around the Cathedral's dome. Looking into Saint Paul himself a few other symbolisms come to light in the artwork – he is the patron saint of missionaries, evangelists, writers, journalists, authors, public workers, rope and saddle makers, and tent makers. His feast day is on June 29 when he is honoured with Saint Peter, although he is also honoured on other days throughout the year.

As another side tangent, but also rather important to this artwork... if you look up close you will notice that the circular dots which trace the image's outlines and textures are not drawn on. The drawing is ink on paper situated on a layer below, and a pure white sheet of fine paper is suspended above the whole drawing. Then, I painstakingly burned in all the holes and performations on the top layer which reveal the depiction of the cathedral. To burn the paper, I used frankincense incense. The real cathedral survived the Blitz although struck by bombs on 10 October 1940 and 17 April 1941. The first strike destroyed the high altar, while the second strike on the north transept left a hole in the floor above the crypt. The latter bomb is believed to have detonated in the upper interior above the north transept and the force was sufficient to shift the entire dome laterally by a small amount."






When the City Folds Over Itself, 2016 Ink on incense-burned tree-skin paper with mirror 85cm x 115cm

Because of the sections of mirror positioned beneath the paper, light plays and bounces under and through the surface of this work which is based on a cityscape inspired by London and Singapore.






Where Man Once Sailed in Search of Faith, 2016 Ink on tree-skin paper 50cm x 73cm

This ink drawing shows Singapore's Rochor River of the past using flowing ink, and Rochor canal the man-made 'neat' version using straight lines. Nicola has burned into the paper using incense at the point where the shore used to be before it became the other side of Beach road.


A Map of London Blitz Nicola Anthony


Windows in Downtown Yangon Nicola Anthony





This artwork is made using a complex drawing in black and white, with a layer of calligraphy paper suspended over the top in white. The white paper shows some shadows and gestures through its translucent surface, but only really reveals the drawing when it is burned into with incense sticks. The drawing underneath shows the windows of hundreds of buildings, taken from Singapore and Myanmar sketches. The image over the top features the hustle and bustle of Merchant Road, Yangon. Nicola likes to think of the burned voids as the swirls of dust of the city, and by peering into each spec of dust you can see the window into a thousand inner worlds.







Revealing the inner worlds of people from different walks of life, this series explores the human condition and threads of commonalities despite our differences. These 8 sculptures were commissioned by Singapore Art Museum and formed one half of Nicola's solo show at Singapore Art Museum in late 2017.

To make these pieces Nicola ventured into disenfranchised communities to work closely with them, building trust to share their stories in a personal interview. These groups included inmates of Changi Women's Prison, children managing chronic and terminal illness, families dealing with addiction, and the elderly community. About this series:


Created by drawing on paper using a burning process. Each piece is mindfully inscribed using an incense stick to perforate the surface and create images in the voids left behind.

The works showcase the stories of those within communities who experience time differently. Whether because their time is not their own, or their lives have become unmanageable. Members of disenfranchised communities have kindly welcomed Nicola and shared their tales.

In this process, Nicola met prisoners whose lives are on pause whilst their time elongates entirely out of their control; families who, due to trauma have difficulty remembering the past; those who have no concept of future because they fear their life may not last another day; and those who are overwhelmed in jobs or situations where they are not in control of their own moments. In each case she has met inspiring individuals who have found the strength to manage their situation by not just being survivors but being overcomers.

Each moon represents the stories and experiences of those in 8 different communities or groups, including the elderly, trauma based families, migrant workers & domestic workers, young adults with chronic illnesses, individuals dealing with addiction, and inmates at Changi Prison.

This work was made possible through partnerships with H.O.M.E. charity, National University Hospital Children's unit, Changi Women's prison, Yellow Ribbon Project, and all the individuals who participated and shared their experiences.



Nicola's was recently invited to have her museum solo exhibition at Singapore Art Museum. This year she has been shortlisted for the prestigious Sovereign Asian Art Prize, she has had artwork travel to Malaysia for the Kuala Lumpur Art Biennale at the National Art Museum, as well as been invited to collaborate in Mischa Kuball's exhibition at the Jewish Museum Berlin.

Nicola also creates large scale installations and public sculptures. Her latest were commissioned for Singapore Art Museum, Facebooks's Asia Headquarters, and public spaces at Marina Bay and Sentosa Island. Around the world Nicola has exhibited at the Serpentine Gallery Project Space (London), the Orange County Center for Contemporary Art (USA), Shinjuku Creators Fiesta (Tokyo), & featured in shows around Asia, USA and Europe. Her artwork has received sponsorship from Tate Britain, & been exhibited in Tate Modern's 'No Soul for Sale'.
